- 1 At the end of subtitle E of title X, add the following:
- 2 **SEC. 1044. REALLOCATION OF FUNDS FOR GROUND-BASED**
- 3 **MIDCOURSE DEFENSE PROGRAM INTERCEP-**
- 4 **TORS TO HOMELAND DEFENSE AND COM-**
- 5 **BATING TERRORISM.**
- 6 (a) REDUCTION.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 7 sion of this Act, the total amount authorized to be appro-

1 priated by section 201(4) for research, development, test,  
2 and evaluation, Defense-wide activities, is hereby reduced  
3 by \$515,500,000, with the amount of the reduction to be  
4 allocated to amounts available for the Missile Defense  
5 Agency for Ground-based Midcourse interceptors.

6 (b) ALLOCATION OF INCREASE.—In addition to  
7 amounts otherwise authorized to be appropriated in this  
8 Act—

9 (1) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
10 by section 3101(a)(2) for the National Nuclear Se-  
11 curity Administration for defense nuclear non-  
12 proliferation activities is hereby increased by  
13 \$210,800,000, with the amount of the increase to be  
14 allocated to the Global Threat Reduction Initiative;

15 (2) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
16 by section 201(3) for research, development, test,  
17 and evaluation for the Air Force is hereby increased  
18 by \$50,000,000, with the amount of the increase to  
19 be allocated to North American Aerospace Defense  
20 (NORAD) for low-altitude threat detection and re-  
21 sponse technology;

22 (3) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
23 by section 304(4) for operation and maintenance for  
24 the Air Force is hereby increased by \$13,300,000,  
25 with the amount of the increase to be allocated to

1 Northern Command consequence management net-  
2 works to facilitate military support to civil authori-  
3 ties;

4 (4) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
5 by this Act is increased by \$130,000,000 for domes-  
6 tic installations Antiterrorism/Force Protection and  
7 Antiterrorism/Force Protection exercises and train-  
8 ing identified by Northern Command, with author-  
9 izations of appropriations to be increased so that—

10 (A) the amount authorized to be appro-  
11 priated by section 301(1) for operation and  
12 maintenance for the Army is increased by  
13 \$19,000,000;

14 (B) the amount authorized to be appro-  
15 priated by section 301(6) for operation and  
16 maintenance for the Army Reserve is increased  
17 by \$15,000,000; and

18 (C) the amount authorized to be appro-  
19 priated by section 301(10) for operation and  
20 maintenance for the Army National Guard is  
21 increased by \$96,000,000;

22 (5) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
23 by section 201(4) for research, development, test,  
24 and evaluation, Defense-wide activities, is hereby in-  
25 creased by \$15,000,000, with the amount of the in-

1       crease to be allocated to the Combating Terrorism  
2       Technology Support Working Group for programs to  
3       detect explosives at stand-off distances, blast mitiga-  
4       tion, and information security; and

5           (6) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
6       by section 3101(a)(2) for the National Nuclear Se-  
7       curity Administration for defense nuclear non-  
8       proliferation activities is hereby increased by  
9       \$30,000,000, with the amount of the increase to be  
10      allocated to the megaports program;

11          (7) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
12      by section 201(4) for research, development, test,  
13      and evaluation, Defense-wide activities, is hereby in-  
14      creased by \$15,000,000, with the amount of the in-  
15      crease to be allocated to the Defense Threat Reduc-  
16      tion Agency for Weapons of Mass Destruction De-  
17      fect Technologies-Radiation/Nuclear Detection;

18          (8) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
19      by section 3101(a)(2) for the National Nuclear Se-  
20      curity Administration for defense nuclear non-  
21      proliferation activities is hereby increased by  
22      \$20,000,000, with the amount of the increase to be  
23      allocated to basic research on radiation and other  
24      standoff detection devices, and for stand-off explo-  
25      sive detection;

1           (9) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
2           by section 201(4) for research, development, test,  
3           and evaluation, Defense-wide activities, is hereby in-  
4           creased by \$10,000,000, with the amount of the in-  
5           crease to be allocated to the Chemical-Biological De-  
6           fense Program for Chemical Agent Standoff Detec-  
7           tion; and

8           (10) the amount authorized to be appropriated  
9           by section 301(2) for operation and maintenance for  
10          the Navy is hereby increased by \$21,400,000, with  
11          the amount of the increase to be allocated to Chem-  
12          ical/Biological Detection Equipment for Explosive  
13          Ordnance Disposal detachments and chemical-bio-  
14          logical protective equipment for Navy and Marine  
15          Corps aircrews.
