

Public transportation propels our region's economy, enhances the livability of our communities and benefits our environment.

-  CCTA's new 2007 emissions standard buses will produce 90% fewer particulate matter into our environment than the rest of CCTA's fleet
-  CCTA uses B-20 biodiesel in conjunction with Ultra-low sulfur diesel
-  CCTA has 15 buses currently available for replacement
-  The typical public transit rider consumes, on average, one half of the oil consumed by an automobile rider
-  Each year public transportation households save over \$1,399 worth of gas
-  Americans living in areas served by public transportation save \$18 billion annually in congestion costs
-  17,565 people commute into Chittenden County each day
-  Almost 4,000 households in Chittenden County do not own a vehicle
